Urban exploration

Urban exploration, if not in conflict with laws and regulations, is a further development of what we before called "boy dashes". It is exploration and documentation of man-made town constructions such as abandoned houses, bunkers/shelters, tunnels/catacombs, subways, mining, and water plant and sewage.

The author describes an exciting story about the group's last urban exploration in a tunnel along one of the main rivers in Oslo. The tunnel was blocked by new construction, but through manhole covers in the tunnel roof, they entered into a building! (The building owner was informed about their security hole afterwards).

Urban exploration is exciting, may cause danger, arouses curiosity, and contributes to historical documentation of nearly forgotten constructions.
