It became known that a French expedition in 1986 had surveyed a large cave in Edvardheimen and named it Rolling Stones Cave. The map did not resemble what was known of Edvardheimgrotta. With a companion (Terje Solbakk) the author entered Edvardheimgrotta and proceeded to "Kvilerommet" – the end of last year's progress. Further exploration resulted in Terje discovering and clearing an exit – "Terjes utgang". The search for Rolling Stones cave was unsuccessful. But six cavers took part in surveying Edvardheimgrotta. Side passages were explored. Svein Grundstrøm developed the theory that the description of the entry to Rolling Stones referred to some other similar place in Edvardheimen. He was right, and the cave was in fact identified as Brattligrotta. The map on p. 28 shows the position of Edvardheimgrotta, Brattligrotta and Storli-grotta. Brattligrotta has even more side passages than Edvardheimgrotta, and it seems necessary to measure and redraw this cave. The map of Edvardheimgrotta was completed (p. 24-25).
