Uthenting av de to omkomne grottedykkerne fra Steinugleflåget i Plurdalen

In the evening of the 6th of February 2014 two finnish cavedivers died in a deep sump in "Pluras underjordiske løp", Rana municipality in Northern Norway. Three other divers rescued themselves out of the cave. The official recovery operation attempt in February from the Steinugleflåget sump upstream was done by three experienced cave divers from BCRA. They could not free the first victim from a restriction at -110 metres. In March, a group of 17 finnish cavers and cave divers succeeded to get the first victim free working from downstream. The downstream passage length is about 1500 meters and a depth of -131 meters. They brought both victims up to the Steinugleflåget sump and informed the Police. The Norwegian Cave Rescue Service (NGRT) brought the victims out of the cave 28th and 29th of March.
